#### **PARISH COUNCIL**



The parish council met in Upwood Village Hall on 04 February and 04 March.

**Councillors:** The council welcomed the appointment of Mark Bacon in February. Councillor Bacon has been actively involved in this community for 25 years. Councillor Hall has resigned his position and a vacancy for his replacement has been advertised. Please apply to the parish clerk. There are currently 2 vacancies.

**St. Peter's Church:** The church path has been repaired. A second green bin is on order and the parish maintenance contractor will collect and dispose of arisings from the churchyard site in future.

**SID:** The speed indicator device is providing valuable data which will help to support future traffic calming strategies. Results indicate that 38% of vehicles approaching the village from Ramsey Heights were in violation of the 40mph speed limit with 2 vehicles travelling in excess of 80mph and a further 27 in excess of 70mph.

**Children's summer sports:** The parish council is keen to provide six 2-hour activity sessions in conjunction with the district council's "Active Lives" programme. The cost of each session is confirmed at £129.24 + VAT. Two sessions have already been sponsored by William Hunt. The parish council would welcome sponsorship from other interested parties and is currently exploring options to work in partnership with Bury Parish Council on this initiative.

**Memorial dedicated to Upwood Airfield:** The parish council has been approached by Airfields of Britain Conservation Trust (ABCT) with a proposal to erect a memorial. The existing memorials specifically commemorate a squadron and individual airmen. Councillors are keen to support this initiative and further information will follow.

**Huntingdonshire District Council news:** There will be slight increase in the cost of collections of bulk waste from domestic properties from 01 April. The cost of a second green bin will rise to £50 and the delivery of a replacement bin will be £15.

Huntingdon based company Charpak Ltd has led the development of a localised circular economy in the re-manufacture of recycled plastic into new packaging products. Huntingdonshire currently diverts over 55% of its waste from landfill.

An online benefits app has been added to the "myhuntingdonshire" portal which provides quick access for registered customers to council services.

#### ALLOTMENT NEWS- 'March wind doth blow'

At the time of writing, the allotments look as fresh as the young buds beginning to open on saplings in the community orchard. This is owing to the wonderful, unseasonably warm weather we experienced in February. Although we had little rainfall during the winter months, the ground still seems quite damp underfoot and the fine weather during the last couple of weeks has encouraged those 'plants in the wrong places' (i.e. weeds!) to start

covering the plots once again. Dwarf daffodils give a splash of yellow from the raised beds in the orchard and nod gently as they are protected by the hedge from the cool blasts of post Storm Freya.

Some hardy, organised folk have already started seriously preparing the soil and planting potatoes and onions. Some plot holders are experimenting with a 'no dig' idea, which involves improving the soil with organic material before covering it with membrane, prior to planting through this later on in the season. The idea is that the soil beneath is warmed but that the weeds are inhibited from growing. This definitely sounds like a good idea, so I will report on the success of this experiment later!

There are still several plots that are looking for willing 'allotmenteers' to till the soil, sow and harvest produce. If you have not seriously considered taking on a plot, please give it some thought. We are a friendly group of people who support one another and there are some who have a lifetime of horticultural knowledge to share. You can have a Green Gym workout for free, feel the fresh air on your face, hear birdsong and have an amazing view to boot! Plus, the sun always shines in Upwood (!) and the view across to the rolling hills in the distance is magnificent!

#### SPOTLIGHT ON UPWOOD ST PETER'S HANDBELL RINGERS

St Peter's Church has been the home of the Handbell Ringers for over 30 years. It was in 1981 or 1982 that Fred Cracknell first took a group of people from St Peter's, who were interested in playing the handbells, to Buckden to listen to an established group. However, this group played 'by numbers' and Fred was determined that the St Peter's group would play 'by music' — and they still do! The players were directed and organised by Fred,



practising every Monday evening and as their skills developed they started entertaining groups and playing in church services.

In the beginning the group used St Thomas a Becket's set of handbells but they had to go to Ramsey to play them as, for some unknown reason, the handbells had to be always kept in Ramsey. Life became much easier for the St Peter's Handbell ringers when, after a huge fund-raising effort, the group were able to purchase their own set

of bells from the Whitechapel Foundry in 1987. John, Daphne and Ruth brought the handbells back from London and that evening they were used for the very first time in Jean & Tony's dining room. This is the set of bells that are still in current use. Some hand chimes were later bought to enable children to experience the concept of hand bell ringing and they are currently used to assist newer members of the group gain confidence in their ringing ability. The membership of the group may have changed over the years but the ethos of playing and enjoying creating music together has never altered.



The Handbell Group has recently changed its meeting time and now meets every Monday afternoon from 2-4pm in St Peter's Church. However, during the winter months, the often take meetings place in someone's house, as these tend to be a lot warmer than the church!

I persuaded a few of the current members to tell me a little bit about their involvement with the Handbells.



Margaret thinks she made the music stand covers over 10 years ago and they certainly add to the professional appearance of the group. Gwen, who is the treasurer, joined in 2003, when 'empty nest syndrome' enabled her to have the time necessary to pursue a new hobby. She generally rings the G & A bells but said that they try to ring each other's bells every so often and several of the team play up to six bells when they 'ring from the table'. Gwen said she particularly enjoys playing for groups who show a keen interest in the handbells, their history and ask about the music being played. Gwen feels that it is even better when they have a go at playing the bells themselves.



Anne-Marie, the events coordinator of the group, joined about 15 years ago because she wanted to have the opportunity to learn to play music in a friendly non-judgemental environment. She also joined husband Vernon, the only original member of the group still playing. Anne-Marie loves being part of a group and playing music that gives joy to its listeners. To quote one satisfied customer: "We all enjoyed your excellent performance and I noticed those with dementia were fully engaged with the music and the interesting explanations. You and your bells are very precious! Thank you once again. Janet". When asked how he coped with all the women in the group Vernon said, "I have to deal with a wife and 2 daughters at home so I'm used to tuning out!"

St Peter's Handbell ringers can be booked to entertain local groups and on these occasions the audience is often invited to 'have a go'.

#### **UPWOOD ART GROUP**





#### ST PETER'S CHURCH

The brief signs of early spring have been very evident in the churchyard. Thanks to the hard work of the contractor supplied by the Parish Council the snowdrops at the east end have made a beautiful show this year. It makes me realise how blessed we are that past generations of parishioners have planted snowdrops, aconites, daffodils and other spring flowers which come up year after year to delight anybody who walks through or past the churchyard. These flowers are also enhanced by the welcome return of the tubs of hyacinths and daffodils which have been nurtured by Peter Haddon over the winter and are now back to line the pathway to the Church. They arrived just in time for the baptism of Matilda Rose Ellis on February 17<sup>th</sup> when the family and friends of her parents, James and Victoria, filled St Peters on a beautiful Sunday morning. They joined the congregation for a service conducted by Canon Darmody, who had married them at St Peters in 2017.

Thanks to the Parish Council, the church path, which has been cracking due to some subsidence and a problem with a soakaway, has been repaired with the offending drainage properly sorted out and the entrance flagstones re-laid level with the newly repaired path. The work has been beautifully done by a local contractor and we are all extremely grateful to those involved.

The PCC has been looking at replacing the heating system and we live in hope that, by next winter, worshippers and visitors will be able to enjoy the benefits of having a much warmer Church.
