Editorial

The future of Upwood Airfield comes to the fore again, Twelve years ago the proposal to build 2,200 new houses on the Ramsey West Development plan met with strong objections in the area, spearheaded by the Brury/Ramsey Action Group. This plan would have seen a bypass from St Mary's Road Ramsey across the airfield, onto Huntingdon Road Upwood between Fairmead and Upwood School and continuing across farmland to join up with the Warboys road near Wistow Toll.

The planning application eventually went to an inquiry and the Inspector decreed that there was to be no further development in the Ramsey area until the B1040 road from Warboys to Whittlesey was upgraded. This was an expensive pre-condition which has not materialised.

Now Strawsons Property are holding an exhibition in Upwood Village Hall for only three hours between 12 noon and 3 pm on Thursday 2nd October. This is too short a time for everyone in the Parish, especially those who work out of the area, to see this exhibition. The exhibition is at Bury Village Hall later that day - from 4-7pm, and in the George Hotel Ramsey On Saturday 4th. October from 10 am til noon.

It is important that everyone sees this exhibition and considers the effect it will have on our community, in terms of health, education, traffic flows and loss of green space. If you would like to know more about the background of previous proposals, just contact the editor. But whatever you do - visit the exhibition and see what the proposal is about.

Free Soccer Skill Sessions For Girls

Sawtry Colts Football Club have experienced steady growth with girls teams over the past three seasons and now run four girls teams from U10 to U13 age groups. To further enhance girls football at the club they are introducing a girls only Football Development Centre for girls of 4-8 years old.

Volunteering is good for you!

Do you know that levels of volunteering relate to levels of happiness? Research published in 2004 indicated that people living in areas with a high level of civic participation were happier with their lives. Hardly surprising then that members of local communities often come to rely upon those volunteers who contribute their time and skills to set up, organise and run many local events. In fact volunteers spend an average of 3 working weeks a year giving unpaid help through groups, clubs and organisations. This is the equivalent of around 1 million full-time workers involved in their local communities.

Many volunteering opportunities are obvious such as helping to plan the village fete, helping with the local Guide or Scout group or editing and publishing the local newsletter etc. However, there are also many 'hidden' opportunities in your local area of which you may not be aware. Do you know about the Community Car Scheme? This scheme is administered by the Ramsey, Warboys and District Volunteer Centre from the Methodist Church Hall in Ramsey and enables those who have difficulty accessing public transport to get out and about. Drivers offer a door to door service using their own cars and are paid directly by the passenger at the rate of 40p per mile. Al and Barbara Fox from Upwood, serve the community in this way and form a great volunteering team.

Want to feel less stressed? 63% of 25-34 year olds and 62% of over 65's say volunteering helps them feel less stressed, while 71% of volunteers who offer their professional skills and experience say volunteering helps combat depression. There are a variety of local opportunities of which these a but a few, such as the role of treasurer, chairperson or trustee on the committees of local charities, mentoring young people, supporting families, or welcoming people home from hospital. Some opportunities are short-term and others involve a long-term commitment, but there is always an opportunity to suit a willing volunteer!

Perhaps you have seen the recent advertising campaign 'Give a few bob' which was launched in June last year. The late comedian Bob Monkhouse was brought 'back to life' and helped raise over £3m worth of free advertising space for prostate cancer through a massive media promotion. This campaign was developed by a marketing company with around 45 staff called The Communications Agency. Robert Prevezer offered his marketing services free of charge to the Prostate Cancer Research Foundation at a time when one of his friends was suffering from the disease.

However, you don't need to wait for such circumstances to motivate you to volunteer. Volunteering England is urging small to medium sized businesses to set up Employer Supported Volunteering schemes in a campaign, supported by The British Chambers of Commerce, the Federation of Small Businesses, the Forum for Private Business and a range of other industry bodies, which is the culmination of a three year project aimed at developing Employer Supported Volunteering. It aims to encourage smaller companies - which account for 59% of private sector employment (Department for Business, Enterprise and Regulatory Reform (BERR)) — to join the ranks of bigger firms that enable employees to volunteer their time to good causes through a work context. If you run your own business and wish to encourage volunteering, perhaps this is something you might wish to consider. At Ramsey. Warboys and District Volunteer Bureau you

will get a warm welcome and support for any aspect of volunteering which interests you.



OBITUARY

. Terry C. E. Wells O.B.E. 1935 – 2008

It is with great sadness that I have to record the passing of my inspirational friend and much respected resident of Upwood, Terry Wells. I was fortunate to meet Terry when he was working as a volunteer for conservation on local Wildlife Trust Reserves and recording plants in the old county of Huntingdonshire. His enthusiasm was infectious and his patience and encouragement with novice botanists was endless.

Terry was born in May 1935. He was educated at Luton Grammar School where Dr. John Dony, his history teacher, encouraged his love of plants. Terry was also a sportsman, playing rugby and cricket in addition to which he was also an accomplished pole vaulter. He went on to study Agricultural Botany at Reading University and it was there that Terry and Sheila met. They married in 1959 and their honeymoon was spent sailing to Jamaica where they lived for the next 3 years. There, Terry worked as an agronomist on a large banana and sugar cane estate and Sheila taught biology in a local school. Terry's sporting prowess endeared him to the locals where he played cricket and helped established the Jamaican rugby union football club.

Returning to England in 1962 he moved to Upwood, taking on the post of Grassland Ecologist with the Nature Conservancy at Monks Wood Experimental Station at Abbots Ripton. In addition to studying grasslands, he went on to study the biology and demography of several wild orchids and other rare plants. In 1982-83, he had a year in Western Australia studying populations of wild orchids. Then, in 1988, Terry gained a Churchill fellowship to visit the eastern states of Australia to lecture on habitat restoration and study orchid conservation. . He retired in 1995 and was awarded the O. B. E. for services to Botany and Conservation in 1997.

Terry was very active in a number of voluntary wildlife and conservation organizations. He was the President of the Huntingdonshire Fauna & Flora Society and in the past had been its chairman. In 1967 he became Botanical Recorder for Huntingdonshire and in 2003, he published the "Flora of Huntingdonshire and the Soke of Peterborough" which was the culmination of thirty years research. Terry had also been a member of the Wildlife Trust since the early 1960's and was the Voluntary Warden at Upwood Meadows. It was largely due to his efforts that the reserve at Upwood Meadows was established. The conversion of Ramsey Heights from a derelict industrial site to education centre was also due to Terry's foresight and endeavours.

Locally, Terry played an active part in village life, as a member and later Chairman of Upwood parish council and also as a keen member of the Upwood cricket team.

Terry passed away on Thursday September 4th 2008 at Hinchingbrooke Hospital, after several years of illness with Parkinson's Disease and more recently, cancer. He leaves his widow Sheila, daughters Beverley and Sarah, son-in-law Tim and grandchildren Ben, Sophie and Matthew.

Terry, with his passion for plants, love of sport and music will be missed by all of his many friends. He will be remembered for his charm and dedication, and for the

valuable contribution he made to the conservation of our natural heritage.
