## COULD YOU SAVE A LIFE?

In our community there is a Magpas Community First Responder Group? It was set up in 2002 as cover to the community when the volunteers are at home. We need more volunteers to enable this life saving group to continue to provide for the needs of all of us.

What is a Community First Responder?

He or she is a local volunteer living within the community who has undertaken training in first aid, oxygen therapy and defibrillation, and when they are available they respond to local 999 calls. This provides initial care and treatment for the patient in their time of need while the ambulance is on its way. Who does a responder attend?

He or she will be notified of patients over the age of 8 who are suffering from life threatening problems like breathing difficulty, chest pains, unconsciousness, fits and cardiac arrest. They can attend and provide lifesaving treatment until the ambulance arrives and then assist the ambulance crew.

How can I get involved?

#### **The Best Laid Plans**

The plot of land containing the late Rodney Scarr's bungalow, on the corner of High Street and Helen's Close has been bought by a developer who submitted plans to build two executive style homes opening onto Helen's Close. The Parish Council rejected the plans twice and the proposal went to HDC's Development Panel on 18<sup>th</sup> May. Local objectors attended that meeting to reiterate their concerns.

The principle argument in their favour was HDC's own restriction dating back to 1988, when the proposal for Thatcher's Close was discussed. This restriction was in essence that Helen's Close and Rodney Scarr's bungalow were single storey buildings and the first building on the corner of High Street and Thatchers Close should therefore be a bungalow - and that is what happened. However, the Development Panel decided that this condition need not apply in the latest proposal, and the objections were over-ruled.

This can have serious implications for us. In the process of raising objections to the 2000 home Ramsey West Development much was made of the poor road infrastructure in this area. At the inquiry, the Inspector clearly stated that there was to be no further large scale development in the Ramsey Area until the B1040 road from St Ives to Whittlesey was upgraded. The CPRE confirmed that Inspector's recommendations are 'cast in stone'. Yet the developers of RAF Upwood hope to get around this condition by tinkering with the road through Upwood and The Raveleys by putting in roundabouts

and traffic calming. Will HDC over-ride the Inspector's report? There is concern that if the developers get away with this not only will traffic through the villages increase substantially, but traffic trying to leave Church lane, Ailwyne Road and Meadow Road will be at risk trying to get into the traffic stream.
