From the Archive Group.

Historypin

If you read the Sunday Times magazine on 18 July you may know something about Historypin. Apologies to those who are already familiar with it; however, there can't be too many Upwoodians in the know as there are no entries for anywhere in this area. This is a good way to put Upwood on the map.

Historypin is a free website (www.historypin.com) and has been created by 'We Are What We Do' in partnership with Google. The idea is to create a map of the world that has pictures and information about buildings then and now. Behind it you have the power of the Google Street Map and can search the website by place name or time or use street view to compare a building through time.

You can add photos of places, houses etc or text - anything to

build up a history of a place. Just simple things like a photo and simple text to say 'Great Aunt Matilda lived here in 1900'. Anyone can add pictures to the website. You can add a picture for anywhere; so if, for example, you have photos of Coventry during the war you can put those on. The website was launched a couple of months ago. With Google backing it the website is not going to run out of space or suffer any of the other fates that befall websites. This may well be Google trying to get back in favour after taking photos of everyone's house but if you have an interest in social history or just in the places you are personally associated with this could be very interesting. You can add things or just look!

Please don't stop adding/giving the Archive Group (www.ccan.co.uk) photos for the website but do think about adding things to Historypin as well. CCAN has much more local detail.

JAMES (JIM) RIGNALL

7th December 1934 - 4th July 2010

Jim was the only child of Herbert and Mercy Rignall. The Rignalls had been blacksmiths in Warboys for two generations, indeed Forge Way in Warboys is where the business once was, opposite their home.

Jim was educated at Warboys school and then attended Ramsey Abbey Grammar School. Leaving school he joined Permanex, a company on Upwood airfield - which fostered Jim's interest in aeroplanes and aviation.

National Service saw Jim in the RAF specialising in Signals and Radar. While posted to Hong Kong he met for the first time his uncle Henry who was in the Royal Navy. Such was the appeal of Hong Kong that Jim considered returning there after his National Service to join the police force.

However he cam back to England and, demobbed, joined Huntingdonshire Council in the "Weights and Measures" department. At that time, 1960, Jim also met Pauline in a pub. They were soon "going steady" and in March 1961 they were married in Trinity Church, Huntingdon. Initially the couple lived in Godmanchester before Jim joined the local Council and they moved to Warboys.

Twelve years later they moved to Upwood where they settled into village life. Jim's public spirit led him to join Upwood Parish Council, serving eight years as Chairman. His fellow councillors remember him for his deliberate speech and his dry humour which oft times enlivened council meetings.

Jim's career was wide ranging. Civil Defence, Atcost in St Ives, Youth Employment in Huntingdon, Photo-Precision, and finally Huntingdonshire District Council where he finished his working life in Pest Control.

Jim loved gliding, gaining Bronze and Silver medals. He felt obliged once to land on Broughton cricket field, an event that was one of many anecdotes of his life that listeners always enjoyed.

Jim was a good keyboard player, both piano and electric organ. He was a member of the Royal British Legion, a Mason and an avid reader.

Seven years ago Jim had a heart attack, from which he recovered. But a heart infection struck him and after eight weeks in intensive care sadly, Jim died.

Our thoughts are with Pauline. We will all miss Jim.
