PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council was pleased to welcome so many parishioners to the September Meeting. On this occasion three separate presentations were made on topics important to the Parish.

THE VILLAGE PUB: Mr John Abbey's talk about his plans for the pub was very well received but we are very sorry to report that negotiations between Mr Abbey and Enterprise Inns has fallen through and Mr Abbey has withdrawn from the process. Very sad news indeed! Mr Abbey was unable to agree to certain terms dictated by the vendor concerning the proposed status of VAT relative to the commercial and residential space. Enterprise Inns were unwilling to adjust their terms to meet Mr Abbey's requirements and this left Mr Abbey no choice but to withdraw. The Parish Council has spent a considerable time negotiating with Everard Cole, the Agents and with Mr Abbey in the hope that some middle ground could be reached, but sadly it was not to be.

The Parish Council will now discuss the next steps with interested residents and will be considering the reinstatement of the Community Asset Registration moratorium; but only if there is reasonable hope of the village community buying the Cross Keys in the near future.

DEVELOPMENT OF CHURCH FARMYARD, CHURCH LANE, UPWOOD: Mr F. Grounds of Maxey Grounds & Co LLP spoke as the managing agent for the Shepperson Family Trust, owners of Church Farm. The Trustees were hoping to develop the farmyard which is no longer in use and wished to share their ideas with the village prior to seeking planning permission. They propose a low density cottage style development making use of the existing "Austrian Barn" and replacing the original dairy with a new, brick, timber and thatched building similar to the existing buildings. Five new homes would also be built in a sympathetic style making in total seven units of accommodation. There would be plenty of parking, garages and open spaces serviced by one main entrance and two small entrances on Church Lane. An architect's impression of the street scene was displayed and a plan of the proposed layout of the houses. Questions were invited from the audience. One question raised was why no affordable houses were included. The need for satisfactory sewerage was also raised. Mr Grounds stated that concerns for removal of foul water sewerage would be addressed by surveyors should the plans be taken further. The Chairman, Robin Howe thanked Mr Grounds and explained that all planning applications are subject to three main considerations: firstly, whether it is appropriate for a particular site to be developed at all; secondly, whether there is a need to consider the provision of affordable housing; thirdly, that all potential new developments are subject to a survey to determine the impact of additional traffic. The architect's drawings and plans will be displayed on the village website.

PARISH COUNCIL continued:

SPEEDWATCH: Mr D. McCandless, St Ives & Ramsey Sector Community Speedwatch Coordinator explained that Community Speedwatch (CSW) which is funded and guided by the Police has been affected by the recession and that Town/Parish Councils have been asked to commit to CSW (or not) by taking on the responsibility for managing and supporting CSW efforts in their respective areas and for receiving complaints of persistent speeding from their residents. He confirmed that two volunteers would be required in this parish for one hour each month. Please let the Parish Clerk know if you would like to be considered as a volunteer. The Chairman confirmed the Parish Council's continued commitment to promoting road safety.

PARISH CLERK: The Chairman and Councillors were pleased to welcome our new Parish Clerk, Carol Bilverstone, a resident of Upwood, who has most generously agreed to serve as the Parish Clerk without remuneration for one year. Mrs Bilverstone had served as a Parish Councillor for four months and under the rules for Local Councils is not allowed remuneration because of this. After one year the post must be advertised and Mrs Bilverstone may apply again and if re-appointed will receive payment. In the meantime Mrs Bilverstone will undergo the necessary training for Parish Clerks.

COMMUNITY LED PLAN (CLP). The Working Party is continuing to make progress. Please see the separate report on page 5.

MEMORIES OF UPWOOD SCHOOL

We asked pupils and former pupils of Upwood School for their favourite memories. **We started with some of the current pupils:**

- 'My favourite thing about Upwood Primary School is Design and Technology week at the end of each term.'
- 'I think the school is great, because everyday everybody learns something new and one day that bit of information will be very important to them.'



- 'Upwood Primary School gives us lots of advice to help us improve.'
- 'My favourite thing about upwood Primary School is seeing everyone smiling and happy at break and lunchtime.'
- 'The teachers can be strict but they are fair.'
- 'upwood Primary School is outstanding because of the great teaching which is in progress every school day.'
- 'My favourite thing about Upwood Primary School is that it makes me feel safe.'
- I like after school clubs because you can do different sports with your friends.'
- 'I enjoy Art as there is a range of activities from clay work to drawing'
- 'My favourite thing about upwood Primary School is lunchtime because you get delicious food.'

MEMORIES OF UPWOOD SCHOOL

Now comments from former pupils:

'In the playground (about where the drive entrance to the Village Hall is now) stood a Wendy House. When it was our birthday we were encouraged to write invitations to 5 friends, I think, and (if they replied and accepted, of course) to have a party usually with homemade shortbread and orange squash, or maybe a



scone or biscuit. Oh, and then a 'thank you' letter had to complete the occasion the next day - as it was good manners to do so.'

Daphne (at Upwood when the village hall was the primary school in the 1950s)

'My memory is from just before I went on stage in the school play in year 6. I was in my costume and the whole class was standing around in silence, partly because of the scene that was on stage but partly because of nerves. It was always so exciting to see everyone dressed up and to look through the curtains and to see the audience watching and waiting. You would step on stage and be hit by the brightness of the lights and then you would see the faces slowly appearing in the darkness.'

Isobel (at Upwood School in the noughties)

Finally a mother and son, both Upwood School pupils:

'One of my most vivid memories is of the hobbit houses being built. We were all so excited about having something new to explore. Outside there were also some concrete tubes; I remember thinking that they were really huge - I couldn't even climb onto the largest one. (Now they seem so small!)'

'I liked my first day of school because I went in the play area and I got to play in the classroom playhouse.'

A VILLAGE HISTORY PROJECT

With the 100th anniversary of the start of the Great War next year it is suggested that our villages could look at the historical records at the time and investigate what our villages were like before the war started.
