PARISH COUNCIL



The parish council met on Monday 7 November 2016.



The meeting opened with the presentation of the "Quality Award" of the local Council Award Scheme. Parish councillors were delighted to be the first in Cambridgeshire to receive their certificate of the Quality Award from the National Association of Local Councils. It was presented by Mr Ian Dewar the CEO of Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Association of Local

Councils. The award recognises the council's good practice in governance, community engagement, council improvement, openness and transparency. Moreover, that it goes above and beyond its legal obligations, leading its community and continuously seeking opportunities to improve and develop even further. The Quality Award is the result of two and a half year's work by the parish clerk, Carol Bilverstone and councillors to imbed best practice in the operation, procedures and accounting within the council. It also focuses on serving the local community to the council's best ability and to make a real difference to the lives of the people who live here.

The council is pleased to announce that the vacancy has been filled by the appointment of County Councillor Michael Tew who will take over the portfolio responsibility for coordinating the delivery of the Community Led Plan and potential development of a Neighbourhood plan. Councillor Tew informed the council that a new district hub will be opened in Ramsey early in the New Year to provide a more cohesive support structure for professional carers.

A motion was tabled and approved that "St Peters Churchyard should be appealing to the eye and it should sustain flora and fauna as a secondary function". Councillors adopted a schedule which clarifies the position regarding maintenance of the churchyard and its future care.

Volunteers are sought from the parish to assist with two projects: winter gritting of the pavements under the county council's "Community Gritting Scheme"; and also to assist with a project to remove overgrowing brambles and ivy from the gravestones in the old part of the cemetery. If you would like to be involved in either of the above please contact the parish clerk.

The next meetings will take place on Monday 05 December and Monday 09 January 2017 at 7:00pm in the village hall. All are welcome to attend.

a wonderful festive atmosphere. All the money raised will be used to fund projects in school.


Christmas Performances

Upwood Quilt Group meets on the last Tuesday afternoon of the month in Upwood Village Hall from 1.30pm to 4pm. Despite its name quilting is not the only craft members enjoy, in fact as many knit as quilt. It was this revelation that encouraged the editors to find out more about the Quilt Group.

The group was started by Deanna Hudson, Janet Philipp and Margaret Jones who realised that there was a need in the parish for a group where ladies could both learn and enhance their sewing skills, in a friendly atmosphere. In the early days the emphasis was on learning quilting skills and all the members worked towards creating a sampler quilt (some are still making this quilt as other projects have taken over!) The group also attended workshops to further extend their understanding and skills.

Constrained decoration When Deanna moved away from Upwood in 2011 a new committee was formed with Ann Harlock and Freda Fotheringham joining Margaret. This trio now direct the group but the focus has moved away from everyone quilting to

a much more relaxed approach of 'bring what you want to do', although every now and then the whole group works together on a project - the latest being the lovely autumnal quilt pictured opposite. Every member made at least 2 squares, with some making many

RAMSEY RURAL MUSEUM



The Museum is now closed for the winter and will reopen at Easter. The season closed with a Food and Craft fair featuring a wide range of traders. It is planned to open the 2017 season with a similar event on Easter bank holiday Monday.

The name suggests that the museum is limited to displays relating to Agriculture and, perhaps, horticulture. In fact the range is much wider than this with displays of domestic history, including a restored 'fen cottage' and replica Victorian rooms and shops, as well as social and local history.

The opening hours in 2017 will be 10am to 5.00pm on Thursdays and 2.00 to 5.00om on Saturdays, Sundays and bank holidays. In addition, the museum is available for group visits at other times by arrangement and these can include guided tours and selected refreshments. The facilities of the museum including a tea room, barn or marquees are available for private events. A film area is being installed in the barn to show films about the history of rural crafts, agriculture and rural life. Volunteers are prepared to visit groups to give talks about the museum.

The museum is run entirely by volunteers and we always welcome new helpers. If you would like to volunteer you can give as little or as much time as you wish. The main day for volunteer work is Thursday although during the open season 'front of house' help is needed when the museum is open to the public.
