PARISH COUNCIL

A meeting of the council was held on 6 March and chaired by Councillor Robin Howe.

The proposed installation of the mobile phone mast on land adjacent to the cricket field was discussed in depth.

The clerk and the chairman have liaised with the District Council and Harlequin Ltd. in an attempt to identify a site which would be more acceptable to this parish. The technical requirements of such an installation are many and complex and Harlequin Ltd. has shared documentation demonstrating extensive research into over 20 sites in Upwood. It seems that there are no other feasible options and it is likely that the Local Planning Authority (the District Council) will allow the plans to proceed. Parishioners who had written letters of objection to this proposal have been kept informed of developments. The chairman expressed regret that the Parish Council must now accept that it can have no further influence and that it has been unable to do more to support its residents. Further details can be found on the parish website and both the Parish Council and community Facebook pages.



Bentley Close play area is to have its annual inspection in April. Further work is to be carried out in Charters Spinney on an ash tree which is becoming unsafe. Following the excellent work done in the old cemetery further work is planned and help from parishioners will be greatly appreciated (please check the Parish Council's Facebook page or contact Councillor Jean Noble on 814356 or at **nimusmum@gmail.com** for further

information).

The Council also discussed a parishioner's suggestion that the village purchase a defibrillator. Councillors agreed that there are many factors to consider but that this is now one of few parishes without such provision, and with a typical 15 - 20 minute wait for professional medical assistance, a defibrillator may make all the difference to someone in need. The Council is positive to the idea; it would welcome further research; and it would be interested to learn of the support such an initiative would have from the community. If the community is able to raise part of the cost, the Parish Council would consider granting financial support. Alternatively, it may be possible to raise the funds through a grant application.

The next meetings will take place on Monday 03 April and Monday 08 May. Everyone is welcome to attend.

HIGH STREET HEDGEHOGS

High Street Hedgehogs has been in operation for over 5 years and in that time over 300 hogs have been treated and released; sadly, not all hogs make it. They often have broken legs or spinal problems and many die within 1 or 2 hours of admittance. Though people are good enough to find my details and bring one to me, they often say they have been watching it for a couple of days sunbathing on the lawn. Any hedgehog out in the day is in trouble – they do not sunbathe. Don't leave it or put it under the hedge - call a local rescue centre ASAP, tomorrow may be too late! I am registered on line and

with all branches of Cromwell Vets as a carer and have had hogs from Cambridge, Bedford, Biggleswade, Peterborough, Stamford and Oundle. Currently I have 26 in hutches in the garage, about half of which have hibernated, thank goodness, plus 11 in the house for fattening or treatment and 16 out with foster carers.

When a hedgehog is admitted in autumn it has a routine check: weighing, treatment for fleas, mites,

ticks and ringworm if necessary. They are all treated for lungworm and roundworm - an injection a day for 16 days. Whilst being treated they remain inside but once fit, at around 800g, they are moved to the garage to hibernate if they wish. This cuts down the amount of work as they are no longer weighed daily or having injections.

Summer arrivals present different problems to the autumn juveniles. They are still

treated for worms (except the tiny babies) but can be released fairly quickly. Babies under 150g need feeding with puppy milk through a syringe; initially 2 hourly, between 6am and 10pm, reducing to 4 times a day as they grow and start on solids. The worst job in the summer is picking off fly eggs with tweezers and worse still maggots. Left on the hedgehog they will eat it alive. I have often spent 2 or more hours on one hog. If the damage is already substantial they are put to sleep.

Anyone wishing to support my work can do so by donating money, items for car boots, newspapers, washing power or food (Pedigree puppy food for the tiniest hogs or lams kitten food in the purple packs for the adults). If I am not about, please just leave things by either gate. Thank you. Jean Noble

SPOTLIGHT ON UPWOOD VILLAGE HALL

Upwood Village Hall started life as a Victorian School, providing education until the new Upwood Primary School was built adjacent to Farm Close in 1959. The old school became the village hall in 1970.

The village hall is managed by a group of 10 volunteers called the Managing Trustees and 3 Custodian Trustees, Isobel Howell, Esther Rowley and Geoff Carrington who oversee the running of the hall on behalf of the parish. This small but very committed committee meets 4 or 5 times a year and ensures that the hall is 'fit for purpose'. They have been very active in applying for grants to update and upgrade the facilities and the parish now boasts a warm, well-appointed and well-decorated amenity including access to Wi-Fi and facilities for video projection.



Steve Howes is the current chairman and has served on the committee for about 16 years. Having moved into Upwood 'all the way from Ramsey' Steve wanted to get involved in parish life. He said "A hall is a hugely valuable asset to any village and provides a place where the community can come together, join in local activities and friendships are forged. We would welcome new members to the committee and if you are interested just chat to one of the committee or contact us at **UVHBookings@upwood.org**. The hall is a 'not for profit' venue and all our hiring fees get ploughed back into the general upkeep of the hall. The hall is owned by the parish of Upwood & the Raveleys in trust, so it is very much 'our' hall

and I would encourage people to make use of it and keep it open so that it remains a valuable meeting place for us all."

Bob Child originally joined the committee around 15 years ago as the representative of the Youth Club. He said "*I* understood that every organisation that used the hall was entitled to a presence on the VH committee so I joined and have never left, despite the YC's demise". He has been in charge of bookings for the village hall for about 11 years. He would like to see the hall being used more. "It's good to see the hall in good nick & I want people to use it. It's available more often than not and isn't expensive to hire. I don't know why more people don't hold parties in the hall – it's much better than having the mess at home" is Bob's view. Bob would like to see a 'Friends of the Village Hall' committee



formed who would run fund raising events 3 or 4 times a year and would love to hear from anyone interested in serving on such a committee. Bob's final comment was "It's a good feeling being on the committee and doing something for the community which doesn't take a lot of time."



Kim Evans is the secretary and also became involved when she was on the Youth Club management committee. "I love working with a fantastic bunch of people who have such a commitment to the Upwood & Raveleys communities. I'd recommend anyone looking for a local venue to see the continued improvements that have been undertaken, which I feel have enhanced the already friendly atmosphere that imbues the hall."

Margaret Carrington has the task of overseeing the

financial running of the hall. As treasurer Margaret is responsible for billing regular users quarterly and other hirers as needed. She said, 'Rates are kept as low as possible but realistically have to cover the costs of running the hall. We are just about keeping our heads above water but if utility costs rise or groups stop using the hall we will be financially embarrassed. Favourable rates are offered to community groups and daytime usage is cheaper than evening hires so it would be good to see greater usage of the hall. It would also be nice to see some



of the younger community involved.' If anyone has any ideas of how to generate greater use of the hall Margaret would love to hear from them.

As the 'house' member of the committee David Williams is in charge of the general maintenance of the building. The other committee members are Doug McLeod, Sean Pender, Andrew Perkins, Lynn Perkins & Tony Place who take their turn in reading the meter and ensuring that the hall is maintained on a weekly basis as well as 'mucking in' with any other jobs that need doing. There are also other parishioners who do not serve on the committee but help with meter readings. Two other very important people are Sally & Geoff Easteal. They are the only paid 'staff' and the difference in cleanliness that these two have made in a very short space of time is fantastic and anyone using the hall will have noticed and appreciated their efforts. Upwood Village Hall is a great community facility which is currently under-used.

Why not use it yourself for a function or to host an activity – you won't be disappointed.

RAMSEY RURAL MUSEUM




The museum opens for the season on 1 April. From now until the end of October it will be open on Thursdays (9.00am to 5.00pm) and on the afternoons (2.00 to 5.00pm) of Saturdays, Sundays and bank holidays.

On 2 April we will hold our opening of the season Food and Craft fair. We will have a wide range of traders with chances to buy interesting food and gifts. This date corresponds with the Ramsey Heritage day when the heritage sites in the town (including the museum) will be open with free admission. As well as the Food and Craft fair, the museum tea room will be open for refreshments.

RAMSEY AND DISTRICT GARDEN CLUB



Ramsey and District Garden Club meets in the Ramsey Community Centre at 7.30 on the third Monday of most months. Visitors to individual meetings are welcomed at a cost of $\pounds 2$ per meeting. The subscription for membership for a year is $\pounds 10$.

In February David Coop gave an enjoyable talk on growing plants for the kitchen garden, covering aspects of plant breeding. The topic in March was Beekeeping, something that is important in view of the declining numbers of bees and the fragility of the colonies. Our meeting on 24 April highlights the penstemon, whilst in May Mike Day's topic is vegetables.
