PARISH COUNCIL



A Parish Council meeting was held on 3 April followed by the AGM and the Annual Parish meeting (APM) was held on 8 May. The key points from the former were:

-There is a Community Defibrillator at the Cross Keys which the council is working to have put into an external cabinet.

-Funds are available to all community groups and for Community projects from the Ramsey Windfarm Community Benefit Fund. £8,000 per annum is available for community projects in this parish. For more information or to make an application go to: http://www.grantscape.org.uk/fund/ramseywindfarmcbf/.

-The parish council's application to the Local Highway Initiative to reduce the speed limit from 60mph to 50mph along Ramsey Road between Upwood and Bury (between the de-restriction signs at Bury and the 40mph signs on the approach to Upwood) together with the inclusion of "dragon's teeth" and village gates has been successful.

The surface of the footpath leading from Bentley Close to the nature reserve and Lady's Wood is the responsibility of Cambridgeshire County Council which is planning to improve the surface and construct a 20 metre long boardwalk over the wettest section. This work will be completed in July, subject to funding, and when ground conditions allow.

-Plans to relocate the "Upwood" sign have proved lengthy and complex but it is now hoped that the sign can be moved to incorporate Fairmead. Ideally the sign would read "Upwood and the Raveleys" or "Welcome to Upwood and the Raveleys" and be replicated at each of the five approaches to the parish.

At the APM 18 community groups and organisations provided their annual reports. The newly appointed vice-chairman, Michael Tew, thanked those who had taken the time to prepare them and added "this is an amazing parish with good community support and lots happening." He added that from his viewpoint as county councillor it had "always been one of the best parishes" in his ward and "it was a great pleasure to be able to serve the parish as vice-chairman." He also offered his thanks and respect to the outgoing vice-chairman Councillor Slater, the newly re-elected chairman, Councillor Howe and the clerk, Mrs Bilverstone for their outstanding leadership of the council and ongoing commitment and dedication to the community.

This hopefully will be in-situ by the beginning of May. As well as this generous donation Parallel UK (based in Spalding) have again sponsored the club with a substantial sum of money to purchase the latest covers; which should ensure that more games are played. As well as replacing the old sightscreen at the far end of the ground we have been lucky enough to be granted a £1210 grant from Sport England to buy one for the pond/pavilion end. RAMSEY RURAL MUSEUM

The museum in Wood Lane Ramsey is now open on Thursdays (9.00am to 5.00pm) and the afternoons (2.00 to 5.00pm) of Saturdays, Sundays and bank holidays. Even if you have visited the museum previously, it is still worth a further visit. There are so many exhibits that it is impossible to see it all at one time, including a restored 'fen cottage' and replica Victorian rooms and shops (chemists, village stores and cobblers).

As well as the normal openings, group visits can be arranged at other times and these can include guided tours and refreshments. All the facilities of the museum are available for private events. Volunteers are prepared to visit groups to give talks about the museum.

The museum is run entirely by volunteers and we always welcome new helpers. The main day for volunteer work is Thursday although during the open season 'front of house' help is needed when the museum is open to the public. If you would like to help, either give me a call or come along at any time between 9.00 and 5.00 on a Thursday.

On Sunday 11 June the museum will be hosting a Murder Mystery Matinee. The play is 'Death of a Songbird'. Entry is by ticket at a cost is £7.50 including refreshments.
