



## **PARISH COUNCIL**

Parish Council meetings were held on 5 June and on 3 July.

Key points were:

The provision of an external cabinet for the community defibrillator at the Cross Keys is ongoing.

Application has been made to the Ramsey Wind Farm Community Benefit Fund to support and promote communication within the parish and beyond. A successful bid will support the cost of WiFi provision in the village hall, the domain and hosting fees for the parish website; an upgrade of the parish newsletter to enhance the quality of the publication; and six “Welcome to Upwood and the Raveleys” parish boundary signs.

The total cost of these projects is £7922.12.

The joint traffic calming project between Upwood and Bury has been costed at £15821.20. The two parishes have jointly been awarded £8750.00 through the Local Highway Initiative and the remainder will need to be covered by the two parishes. The surface of the footpath leading from Bentley Close to the nature reserve and Lady’s Wood is the responsibility of Cambridgeshire County Council which is planning to improve the surface and construct a 20 metre long boardwalk over the wettest section. This work will be completed in 2017 subject to funding, and when ground conditions allow.

The Parish council is to hold surgeries for parishioners on the second Saturday of the month at the village hall from 2pm - 3.30pm. This is to give time for concerns to be brought to the council in a less formal setting than a full council meeting when time is also limited. The first surgery will take place on 9 September.

A new cradle swing has been installed at the Bentley Close pre-school play area for younger children.

The council agreed to purchase photo identity badges for councillors to wear when on council business.

## GLOBAL SUCCESS FOR LOCAL FIRM

Did you know that a world championship winning firm manufactures its products in the middle of our parish? No doubt for the majority of parishioners the answer would be 'no', but believe it or not a firm that has been established in Upwood village for 3 generations is still producing world beating fishing rods today. Some of the older or more established parishioners will now know that I am talking about Bruce and Walker, the fishing rod manufacturers who now produce their fishing rods in a building behind the garage in High Street, Upwood. Originally the manufacturing occurred in the part of the village now called Fisherman's Close, which was named 'in homage' to the firm.

In April the World Championship Tournament Casting Competition was held at the Golden Gate Angling Club in San Francisco. In the salmon fishing world this competition is rather like Formula 1 is to the racing world. Bruce and Walker won EVERYTHING – 1<sup>st</sup> place in the men's and ladies' competitions and to add salt to the wound of the big firms Bruce and Walker had 4 of the top 10 men using Bruce and Walker rods. This is the first time a manufacturer has won both competitions and in the case of the ladies it was with a world record cast!

So a little family-run firm in little Upwood beat all the manufacturers from all over the world including countries like China and the USA. The David v Goliath of the fishing rod world! What an amazing and fantastic achievement.

This family firm has been providing employment in the local area since 1959. It is one of the few remaining British manufacturers of hand-built fishing rods in the UK. They put their success down to Brian's designs, re-designs and working weekends and late nights just to get the designs configuring perfectly. When the news of their success was heard everyone at Bruce and Walker celebrated in true British style– with a cup of tea and a slice of cake!



At other times group visits and private events (barbeques, parties, wedding receptions, meetings, photography sessions etc.) can be arranged. Volunteers are prepared to visit groups to give talks about the museum. We have so many exhibits that you are likely to find something new or that you missed on a previous visit.

Over the weekend of 8/9 July there was the 'Steam and More Rally' with 20 miniature steam engines and classic fire appliances that gave demonstrations of firefighting. Some paraded through the town. Funds were collected for the firefighter's charity.

The museum will be open over the weekend of the 1940's event (19/20 August) with free entry to the museum; an additional experience of the 1940's.
