## PARISH COUNCIL



Meetings of the Parish Council were held on 4 December and 8 January at Upwood Village Hall.

The Parish Council is holding surgeries on the second Saturday of

each month at the village hall, there will be one on 10 February from 2pm until 3.30 pm. This is an opportunity for residents to meet with councillors to discuss their issues and concerns in a less formal setting than a full council meeting and without a time limit.

Some highlights from the meetings are as follows:

#### Highways

Cambridgeshire County council will be starting work on the traffic calming on Ramsey Road early in the New Year. This will include six new parish boundary signs placed on approaches to the parish. In addition, work will be done on the footpath from Bentley Close to Upwood Meadows. This should be completed by March.

## The Fitzwilliam (Milton) Hunt

A significant disturbance was caused as dogs from the Fitzwilliam (Milton) Hunt progressed cross-country from Wistow directly through Upwood village in the direction of the Great Fen. Many parishioners have expressed concern not just for the legality of the activity but also for the safety of residents, the distress to domestic pets, and the protection of private property. The police were called but did not attend the incident. A letter of apology was received from the Hunt (available to view on the community and Parish Council Facebook pages) and after discussion the Chairman has written to the hunt stating *"there is no doubt that the incident provoked fear, outrage and anger among our residents and accepting the fact that some of the complaints came from hunting opponents, the Parish Council strongly criticises your inability to control hounds and riders and requests that you take all precautions to avoid a repeat of this unfortunate incident" (full letter available as an appendix to the full Parish Council minutes).* 

#### Youth involvement and Engagement

This is an area that is being investigated by the council. HDC is offering the parish the opportunity to engage with its "Active Lifestyles" summer activity programme. (For more details see the separate flyer, delivered with this newsletter.) A requirement to engage with the youth of the parish on a more strategic and sustainable basis is also being sought.

**County Success:** It is with great delight that we have recently had four of our juniors confirmed for county sides. Sophie Lawrence (*Left*) and Annabelle

Woodward (*Rt*) played in the county girls under 11 squad last year. Sophie has developed into an outstanding leg spinner who not only turns the ball with good flight but her accuracy is extremely

good, particularly for a young "leggie". Annabelle started as a mainly seam/swing bowler but it is her batting that has flourished and she is now playing a full range of shots against different types of bowling. The girls are now part of the U13 girls squad which will offer them fresh challenges.

For the first time in a number of years 2 boys will be representing the county. After trials Jacob Milner (Rt) and George Tuffin (L) have been selected to join the 18 boys in the u-10 county squad. Jacob is a powerful left-hand batsman and right arm fast bowler and George has shown a keen eye for the ball both batting and wicket keeping. Over the next few years Upwood should have even more representatives in the county teams.

## JUDGING OF THE CHRISTMAS TREE FESTIVAL
