REMEMBRANCE MEMORIAL IS UNVEILED



On a gloriously sunny afternoon, a very moving ceremony was held on Longholme Road on 7 September to honour 2 airmen who lost their lives in WW1.

Watched by one of the men's wives, they were killed when their FE2b crashed after take-off from Upwood Airfield in September 1918. 80 to 100 people, of all ages attended the service.

PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council was pleased to welcome parishioners to the PC meeting on 1st September.

WW1 MEMORIAL: Tony Place reported that the unveiling of the WW1 Memorial will take place as planned at 5.00pm on Sunday 7th September followed by a buffet in the Cross Keys. (This has now taken place and was very well attended.)

SPEEDWATCH: Signs denoting that this is a Speedwatch area have been erected.

STREET LIGHTING: This has now been completed in stages by the specialist teams from Balfour Beatty. Light is mostly directed down towards the road and pavement but there may be a small amount of backward light. Shields can be fitted if residents are affected by this. If villagers have any complaints please let Carol Bilverstone, our Parish Clerk know (by email: **parishclerk@upwood.org** or in writing to 9, Meadow Road) so that so that she can contact Balfour Beatty.

FLOODLIGHTING ON THE AIRFIELD INDUSTRIAL SITE: Please let the Clerk know if this is still proving a problem in the darker evenings.

HEALTH HAZARD FOR DOGS: A dog in Wistow has died as a result of eating slug pellets used on farmland.

BONFIRES: Please be aware that bonfire smoke can be a real nuisance at night as well as in daytime. Please check the wind direction before starting a fire and never leave a fire unattended. No fire should be so big that it cannot be put out easily if the wind changes.

BLOCKED ROAD DRAINS: Cambridgeshire County Council has been made aware of the silting up of the drains on Longholme Road but to date we are still awaiting action.

On 5 Sep St Peter's Church was full as family and friends came together to remember Elizabeth 'Libby' Perkins who had died on 22 Aug. One of her granddaughters read the lesson and three of her grandchildren read a poem, while her son, David, told us all about his mother. We, at St Peter's, will miss both her and her flower arrangements at festivals, which always had a touch of the garden flowers she loved so much. We all send our prayers and love to Michael and the family as we remember a lovely lady.

The families of 2nd Lt Parks and 2nd Lt Thompson came to St Peters Church to see their relative's names on the war memorial in the lady altar on the morning of 7 Sept. They were very moved and also very interested in the church. They were wondering if Albert's mother had anything to do with the memorial because she was a sculptor and knew a number of well known artists of that time. We also found out that one of Albert Parks' younger brothers was a padre in the Second World War and had been a vicar in a village near Sandringham and the other brother had been a silversmith; but perhaps one of the most interesting things that we discovered was that Albert had been married for 2 months at the time of his death.

UPWOOD HONOURS DEAD AIRMEN

Tony Place has lived in Upwood for 37 years and was in the RAF until he retired 26 years ago. Since then he has been an ardent supporter and campaigner for the Royal British Legion. It is totally due to Tony's persistence that the commemorative event on Sunday 7 September to honour 2nd Lt. Thompson & 2nd Lt Parks, the two airmen who died over Upwood airfield during World War 1, took place at all. It has been a real labour of love and brilliantly aided and abetted by Jean, his wife, he has seen this project through from an initial email contact in January 2014 from Lt Thompson's grandson, Ellison Withe, to St Peter's Church asking if anything was happening to commemorate the start of WW1.

The editors went to see Tony two days after the service. He was still elated about the response from the village and was absolutely delighted with how smoothly the whole weekend had turned out.

Are you able to talk us through the process you went through to get the memorial and service a reality rather than just your dream: "For many years their names have been read out as part the Remembrance Day service in St Peter's and I have put poppies on the two Commonwealth War Graves in the old cemetery. When I saw an article in the Eastern Daily Press about a memorial to two airmen who had lost their lives in a WW2 crash I thought 'If

they can do it so can I.' I spoke to various local people and applied to the Parish Council to erect a memorial. Everyone was so supportive and I would particularly like to thank the PC, especially Councillors Keith Sisman and Garth Slater for all their help in bringing this project to fruition.

I had already arranged for Ellison to come to the Remembrance Day Service in St Peter's to hear his grandfather's name read out and then Ellison made contact with Rose Savage, a niece of Lt Parks. Both were very interested in coming to Upwood. Rose actually had her uncle's war record and Ellison had also done a lot of research into his family tree. When I mentioned that I would like to dedicate a memorial stone, sited opposite the end of the original WW1 airfield in memory of their ancestors, they were very touched and felt honoured that it should be done.

The first time Jean & I met with both extended families was on Saturday 6 September at the Dolphin Hotel, St lves, for an evening meal. The choice of venue was rather appropriate since the emblem for the 191 squadron (the squadron both airmen were in at Upwood) is a dolphin.





The memorial has been financed from donations. I am so grateful to, and would like to thank, Swearers for donating the granite stone and financing the engraving, Terry Tye who kindly donated the bricks and Andy Duncan & Mark Attfield who donated their time and energy to construct the memorial. The only expense incurred was for the hospitality at the Cross Keys on the day, which the families and the Parish Council contributed to. Thanks also go to the Cross Keys for their hospitality. The families were also able to see where the men had been billeted; Lt Thompson at 30 High Street and Lt Parks across the road (on the site where Connie Edwards now lives).



The families, Jean and I were all extremely moved that so many people) came to the service, both from the parish and beyond. Tony Perryman, the Huntingdon Branch RAFA Padre, led the service and his wife Margaret read the lesson. I read the 'Act of Remembrance' and Jean a poem by Dr Paul Garber called 'To Fly', while Jack Brooker from Somersham Town Band played the last post and reveille. Paul Hutton & Josh Richardson, two Flying Officers from RAF Wyton, laid a wreath, as did the families, but perhaps the most moving tribute of all was that of Zoe & Amy Jenkin, who of their own accord, picked some flowers in

the morning and asked their grandmother if they could lay them at the memorial, which they did. The sun shining through the flags on the fence just added to the very special atmosphere.

The memorial is there to remind present and future generations of the sacrifice made by our armed forces. I am contacting the War Memorial Register and sending them a photograph so that the information can be included on their website."



Ellison said that the day was 'very, very emotional' for him and it was a day that he will remember for the rest of his life', whilst relatives of 2nd Lt Parks said, 'It was a wonderful surprise to find that the people of the village of Upwood were planning to dedicate a memorial stone to the two airmen who were killed on 7 September 1918, one of whom was our fathers'

brother. We were all very moved by the sincere simplicity of the ceremony, kindness and generosity of the people of Upwood and the tremendous amount of thought, planning and work that had gone into the organisation. What was also overwhelming was the number of people who attended the dedication, for two people they had never known. Our heartfelt thanks go to Tony and Jean Place, but we know that many more people were deeply involved in the planning and the execution of the ceremony. Thank you all.'

Tony and Jean did a brilliant job realising Tony's dream and they should be really proud of their efforts. Go along to Longholme Road and take a moment for reflection on the sacrifices our ancestors made and our contemporaries continue to make today to keep us safe.

Finally, a quote from Paul Hutton on behalf of the RAF:



'It's an honour to represent the RAF at such events and commemorate the losses that have been suffered both at home as well as overseas. As we train in modern, capable, and safe aircraft based at RAF Wyton it's hard to imagine that nearly a century ago these two pioneering junior officers were risking their lives in such a basic and fragile aircraft at an airstrip not far from here. It's important that as such events fade from living memory we remember their sacrifices with memorials and services such as these. The memorial itself was a tasteful and

fitting tribute to 2nd Lieutenants Parks and Thompson and was a culmination of a great deal of hard work by residents, particularly Tony Place, the families, and local organisations.'

UPWOOD VILLAGE HALL



With the help of grant funding from WREN, the village hall has just completed its 'Roof Insulation Project' which should significantly reduce heat loss through the ceiling in the front hall as well as improving the level of comfort throughout the building. Both halls have also been completely redecorated with the new white ceiling in the front hall providing a feeling of extra light and space in what was previously a rather dark area.

We are now embarking on a programme of replacing the heavy steel-framed chairs with lighter aluminium-framed versions as well as providing some chairs with arms as requested by hall users.

UPWOOD AND THE RAVELEYS HISTORY GROUP AND VILLAGE HISTORY PROJECT

The History Group is a friendly group that meets in the Upwood Village Hall on the third Wednesday of alternate months. The meeting in September was a talk by Andrew Tatham entitled "A Group Photograph – Before, Now and In-Between". This evening exploring his great–grandfather's WW1 regimental photograph was totally fascinating. The time Andrew has spent researching and recording the lives of the 46 people pictured in this photograph is incredible; he held us spellbound for over one and a half hours as he detailed in words and animation his discoveries. This has to have been one of the best talks we have had the pleasure of experiencing. In November (19) the talk will be on a more local theme with a discussion about new discoveries at the Ermine Street Excavations.

Visits are also organised to sites of interest either locally or by travelling a little further to enjoy the delights of surrounding counties. Annual membership is £10 but visitors are welcome to individual meetings at a cost of £3.

Edwardian Upwood: This on-going project, exploring records to discover more about the life of the parish in 1910 is always looking for more information and volunteers. We are also developing a time-line chart of the villages and are interested in anything that happened back to the medieval period but also more recent events. Following on from our grant from the Community Chest Fund earlier this summer, the Upwood & Raveleys Community Allotments Association is delighted to announce that our application to the Woodland Trust for a hedgerow pack has been



approved. We will be receiving our large pack of hedging trees in November. There will be a mix of native trees specially designed for hedging including blackthorn, hawthorn, rowan and oak, supplied as whips of between 20 and 40 cm high. These will be used to repair the existing hedgerow in Meadow Road, especially near the junction with the Huntingdon Road and to replace missing hedgerow on the Huntingdon Road. CHANGES TO STAGECOACH BUS ROUTES

Route No 45 (Huntingdon – St Ives) - 18:45 and 19:15 now operate 5 minutes later (with effect from 1 September).

Busway A & B (Huntingdon – St Ives – Cambridge) - A waiting time at Huntingdon bus station has been introduced for B journeys starting or ending at Huntingdon rail station or Hinchingbrooke Hospital. Arrival times at the rail station and hospital are now 6 minutes later; departure times from the rail station and hospital are now 8 minutes later, (wef 1 Sep).

Busway A - 06:49 journey between Brampton and Cambridge now ends at Regent Street, not the rail station. Busway A - 07:02 journey between St Ives and Cambridge now ends at Regent Street, not the rail station. Busway A - New 08:18 and 08:33 journeys between Oakington and Cambridge rail station, (wef 7 September)

Busway B (Huntingdon – Peterborough) - Busway Changes to route in Huntingdon – now uses Edison Bell Way to serve Huntingdon rail station then George Street and Walden Road. No longer serves St John's Street, Cromwell Walk, Brookside, Nursery Road, Riverside Road or Castle Moat Road. No impact on departure times, (wef 1 September).
